## Record your answers. Use a timer.

If you record your answers, you will be more prepared when you take the test.





# General Tips

## 1. Use **NATURAL** words and phrases

Many of my students say, “Teach me some words and phrases that will increase my score from 7 to 9.” This is the wrong kind of thinking. There are no magic words you can use in every question to increase your score. If you try to do that, it will probably sound unnatural and you will lose marks. It’s much better to use simple natural words than complex unnatural words. For example, one of my students said, “the benign man”. She was trying to say, “the friendly man”, and she thought the word “friendly” was too simple. She wanted to use a big word, but her answer was confusing. If your answers are confusing, you will get a bad score. **ONLY** use advanced vocabulary and phrases if it is natural in that situation.

## 2. Speak with a calm, cheerful tone of voice

The speaking test is the last part of the exam. You might feel exhausted after sitting in the chair for three hours, but try to stay positive! Don’t sound tired or bored. Listen to a recording of your voice. Does it sound good? Is it easy to understand?

### 3. **Say MORE**

Use the full amount of time for each answer. If the question gives you 90 seconds to speak, you should practice speaking for at least 80 seconds. But don't say the same thing over and over again! When people are nervous, they often repeat themselves. Your answer should have more **substance** and less **fluff**. "Fluff" means saying useless things to fill the time. Try to think of two or three points to talk about in each question and write down some simple notes to help you remember.

### 4. **Practice fast transitions between questions**

On the CELPIP test, you cannot stop and rest after each question. If you do poorly on a question, you need to forget about it and move to the next one. Practice fast transitions between questions.

### 5. **Learn English**

Honestly, the best way to prepare for the test is to learn more English. It's impossible to know what the questions will be, so you have to be ready for anything! I would recommend watching the videos on my YouTube channel (Mad English TV). You will learn new words, phrases, idioms, and more!

In this question, you need to give some polite advice to someone. Try not to sound bossy.

## **DON'T say:**

## **DO say:**

You might want to consider getting a gym membership.

It would be good to cut out junk food from your diet.

Personally, I would stop drinking cappuccinos.

You could start jogging every morning.

One thing you could do is find a workout partner.

In my experience, running is a great way to burn calories.

I would recommend hiring a personal trainer.

I would suggest going swimming every evening.

# My Answer

Hey Ryan,

After the opening sentence, you should tell him that you will be absent from work.

"Unfortunately, something urgent has come up for tomorrow."

In this question, you should take a clear stance on the subject. That means your opinion should be very clear, and it should be stated at the beginning of the answer.

Try to take a few simple notes. My notes would look like this:

More time  
Care more  
Real life education

For this question, you don't need an introduction. Your opinion *is* the introduction. Try to have a short conclusion though.

Use examples to fill up time.

# My Answer

I definitely agree that parents are the best teachers. There are several reasons why I believe this. First off, parents spend far more time with their children than any school teacher does. Most kids don't start going to school till they're 5 years old. I think it could be argued that a child learns more in those first five years than they do in the rest of their life. For example, they learn how to talk; they learn how to eat; they learn how to use the bathroom. Even when a kid is in school, they still spend more time with their parents than with any of their teachers. The second reason why I think parents are the best teachers is because they care the most about their kids. Usually, the people who care the most try the hardest. Sure, most school teachers care about their students, but at the end of the day, it's just a job. They have so many new students every year that they can't possibly develop a real relationship with any of them. Parenting, on the other hand, is much more than a job. It's a life of commitment and sacrifice. The third thing I would say about parenting is that it provides a different kind of education. Parents are the ones who teach their kids how to share their toys, how to eat healthy food, how to deal with conflict, how to express emotions. # Tips

There are two differences between task 8 and task 3. Firstly, in task 8, you're talking to a person. In task 3, you're just describing the scene. Secondly, in task 8, you need to use more specific vocabulary to describe the scene or object.

The purpose of this question is to test you on your ability to use the right words in an unusual situation. Many people struggle with this question because their vocabulary is not advanced enough.

For task 8 and task 3, vocabulary is the most important thing. In this book, I will try to teach you vocabulary that will help you on the exam. :)

# My Answer

# Tips

Remember, when you give advice to your brother, you're not telling him what he should do. You're just giving him suggestions. After listening to your advice, he will make his own decision.

In this question, "how to buy a car" is referring to the general process of getting a car. What should your brother do first? Some people take these kinds of questions too literally. They might focus on the word "how" and think:

Pay money

Sign papers

Get license plate

If you give an answer like that, it's probably okay. But really, this question is not that technical. Don't overthink it. Just give him practical advice on where he should start looking for a car and then maybe tell him some other aspects of the process if you have time.

# My Answer

Hey Mike, I'm really excited for you that you got your driver's license and are looking for your first car! I've bought and sold several cars in my life, so I think I can give you some good advice. Since you just graduated from high school, you probably don't have a huge budget for a vehicle. The good news is that there are always lots of great second-hand vehicles for sale. I just bought a 2008 Toyota Corolla on Kijiji for \$2800. Have you browsed Kijiji yet? That's a great online community for second-hand things. Another website is Craigslist. I would start by taking a look on those sites and figure out what kind of car you want to buy. Some people prefer buying vehicles from a dealership because there's less risk of the car being a lemon. Personally, I prefer a private sale because you can haggle more over the price. Anyway, after you've found one you like, you send a message to the seller and ask if you can look at the vehicle and go for a test drive. If you like the vehicle, then you make an offer on it. # Tips

In this question, take a careful look at the picture. Make sure you understand what is happening in the scene because this picture will be used for this question *and* the next question! Personally, I wouldn't take any notes for task 3 and 4. The picture itself is your notes. But everybody is different. Maybe notes would help you.

Remember to use terms like “right side” and “left side”. The words “foreground” and “background” are also good, but some pictures don't have a foreground and background. For example, the picture of the bathroom with the plumber didn't have a foreground or background. This picture of the zoo has a background but not really a foreground. If you use the word foreground here, that's okay, but it's better not to use those words unless there is a clear distinction between the background and the foreground. In this picture, the sky and clouds are clearly behind the zoo. But what is in the foreground? The zoo? The girl using a smartphone? Personally, I wouldn't use “foreground” in this example.

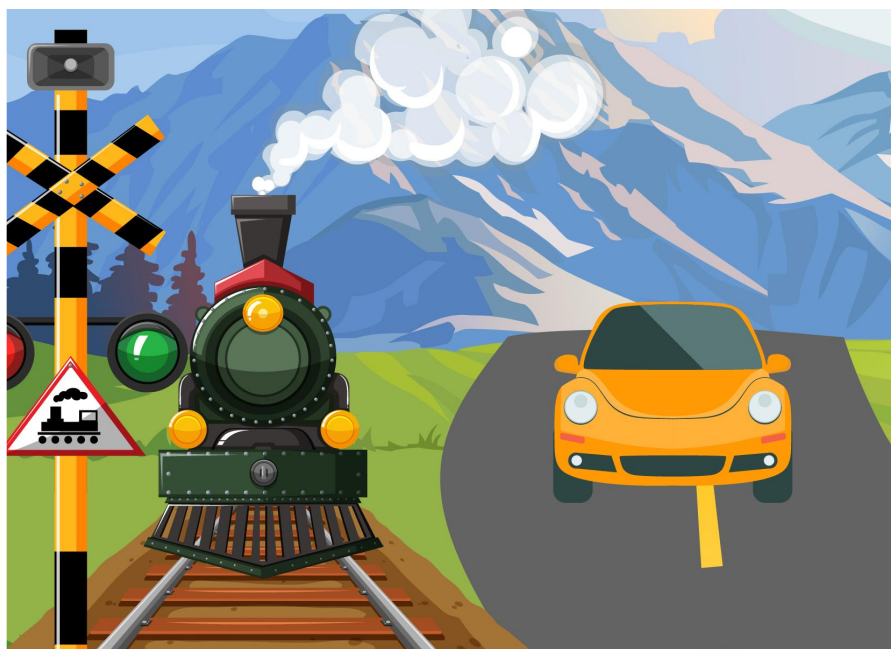

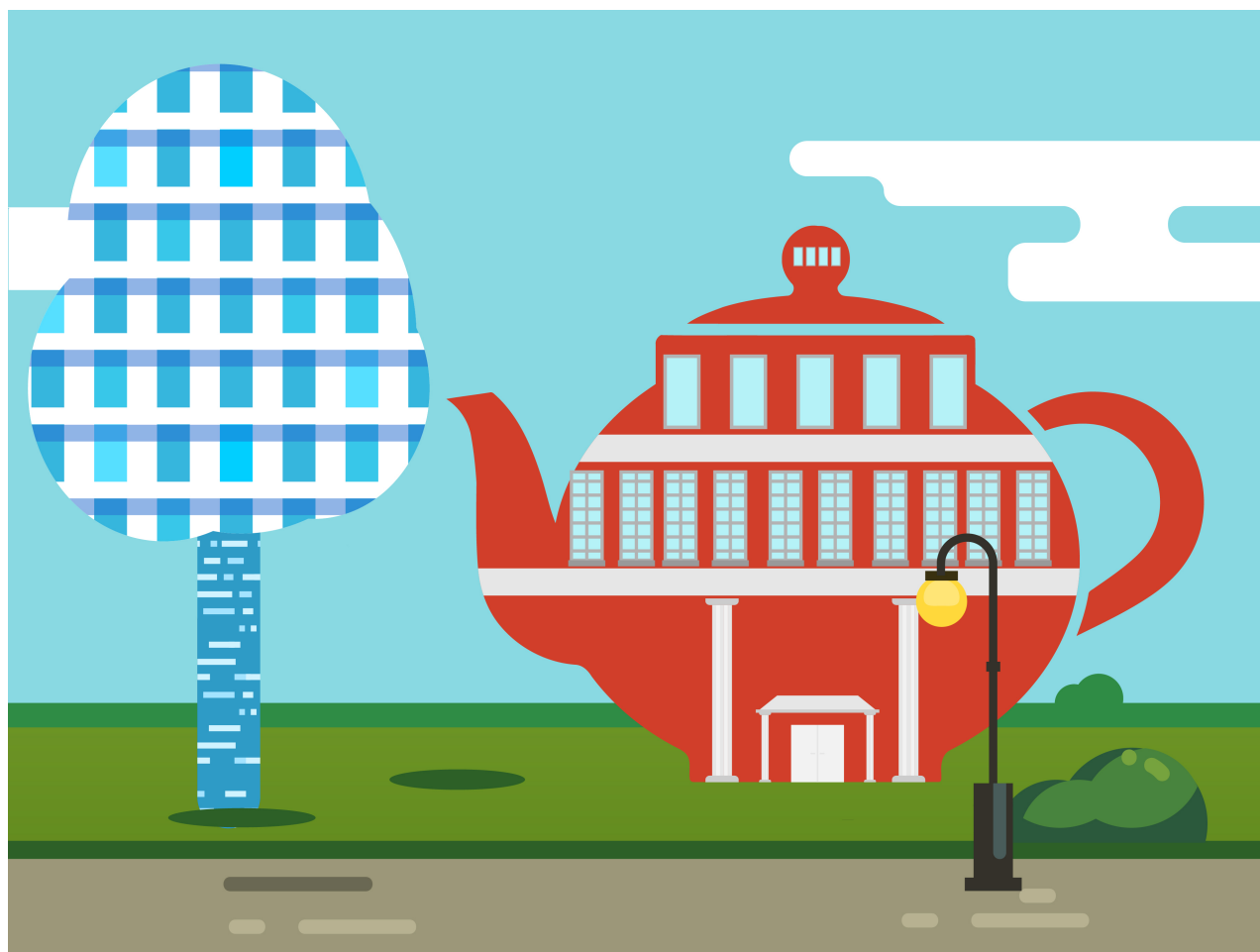

# My Answer

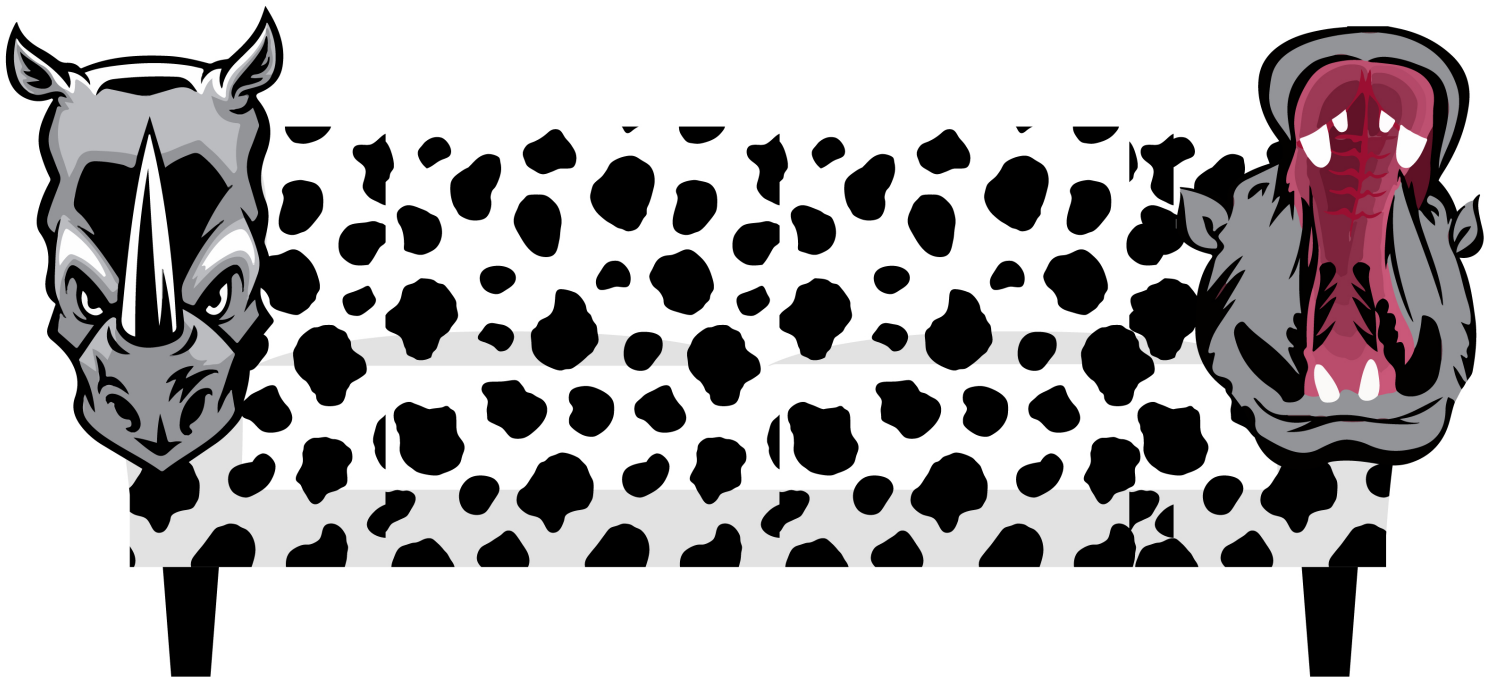

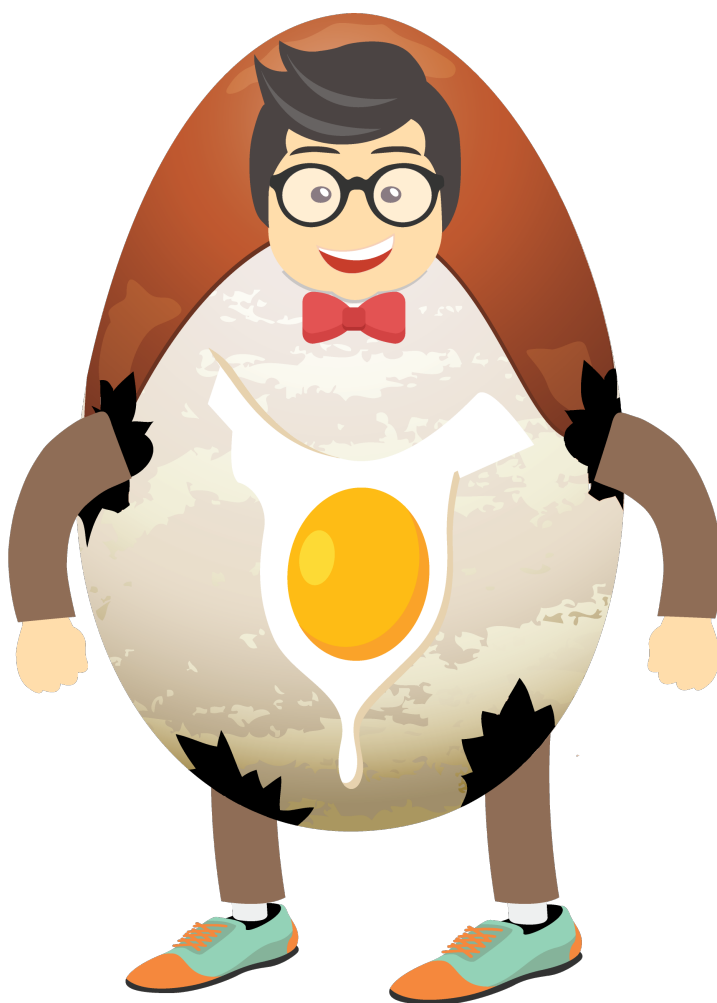
# My Answer

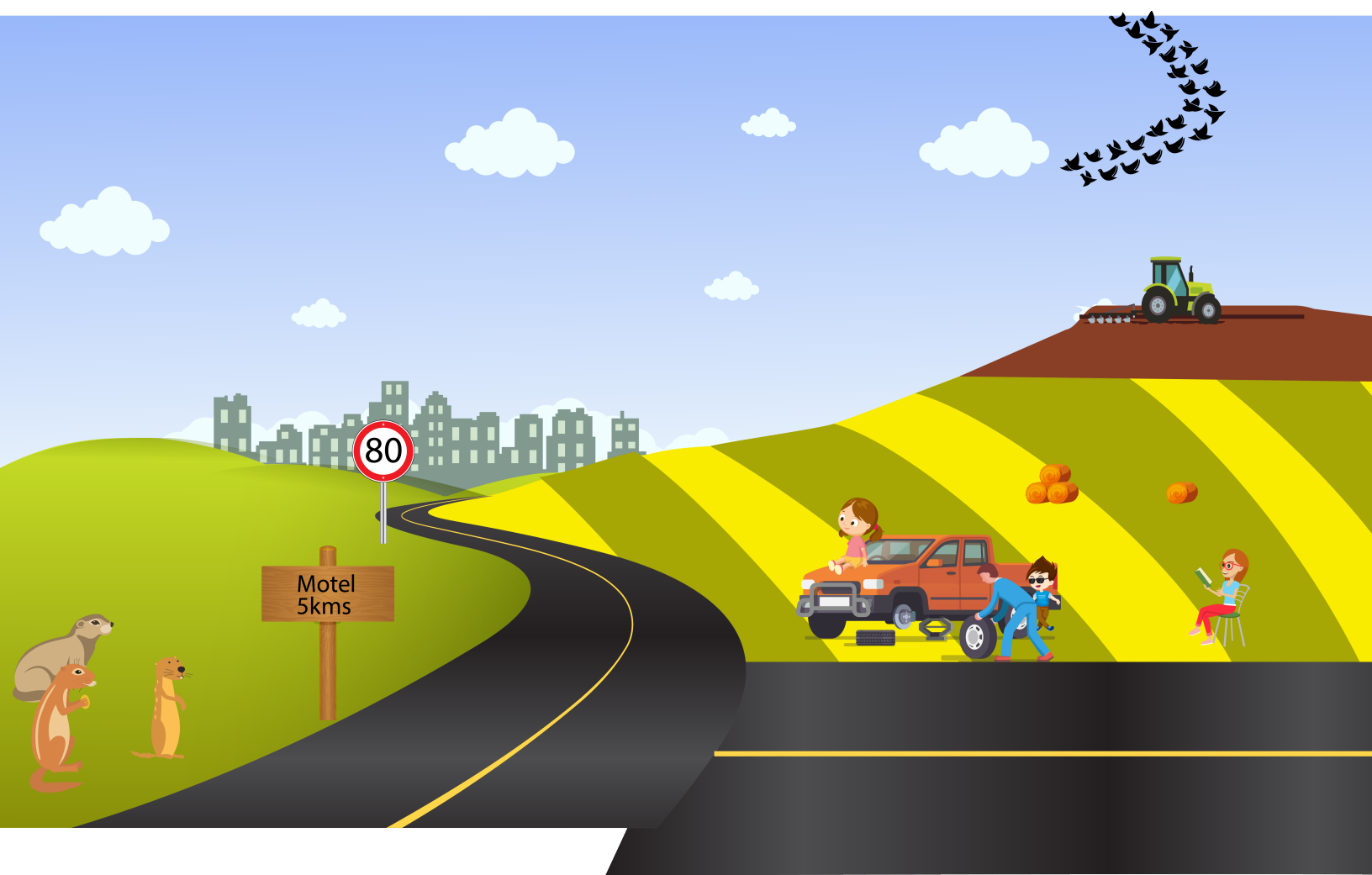

In North American English we use the word “game” instead of “match” to talk about most sports. For example,

Soccer game

Football game

Baseball game

Hockey game

But with boxing, we use “match”.

In some of my answers in this book, you’ll see that I use rhetorical questions. A rhetorical question is a question where you’re not asking for an answer. The answer is obvious. The following question is an example of a rhetorical question that doesn’t need an answer.

“Do you really want to stand for one and a half hours?”

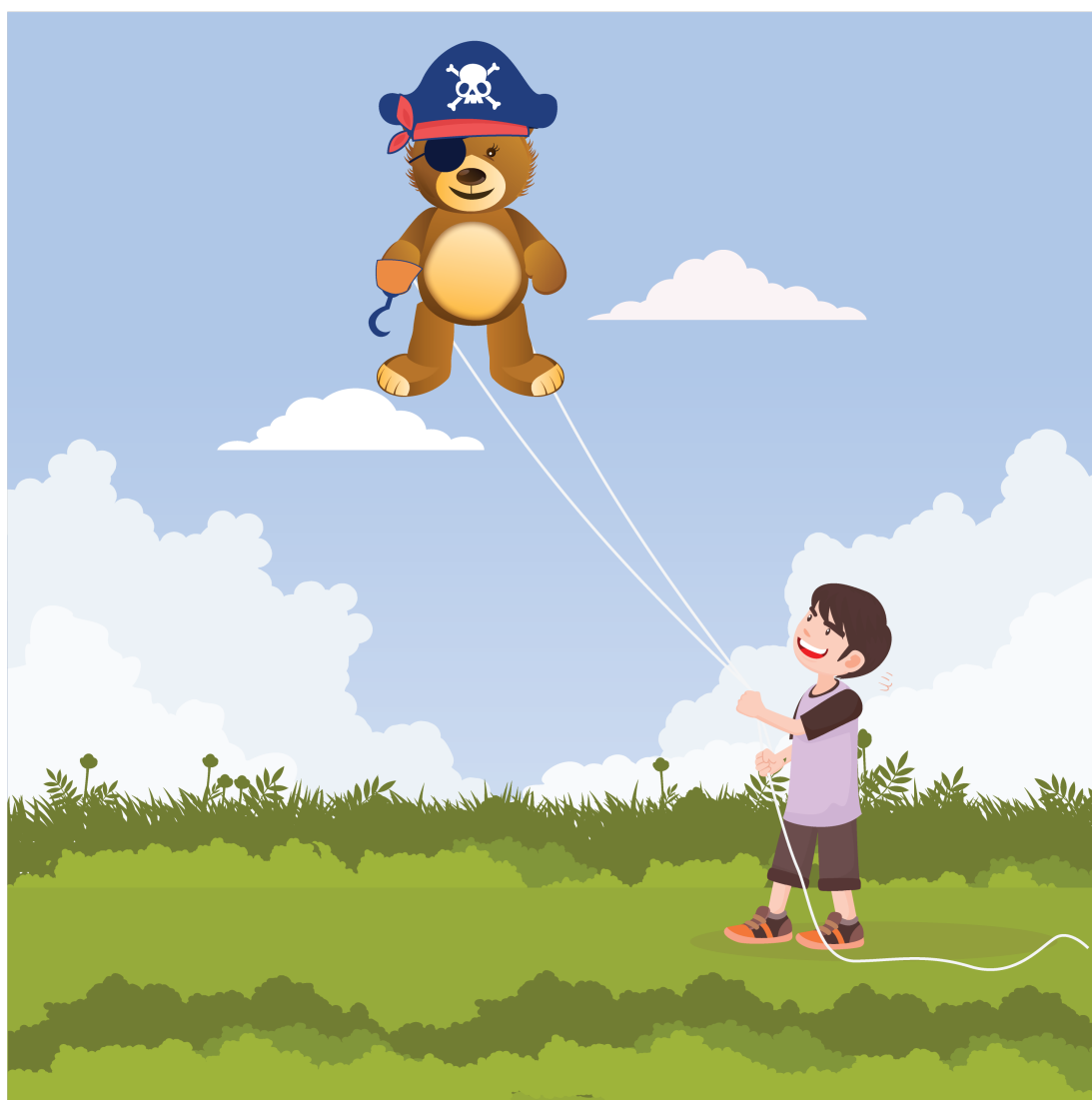
Hmm, let me gather my thoughts for a second...

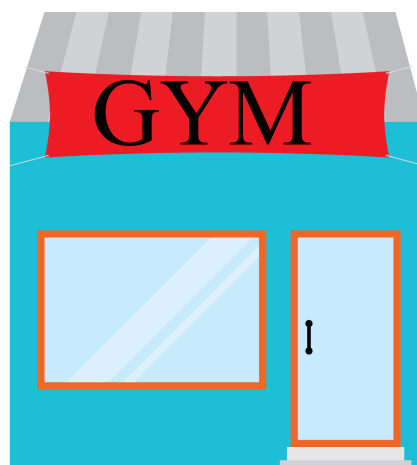

# Closing Comments

I want you to stop for a moment and congratulate yourself for all the English you have learned. And I want to congratulate you too! **CONGRATULATIONS!** Regardless of your score on the CELPIP exam, you should be proud of yourself for speaking another language. That is a huge accomplishment!

As you read through this book, you probably realized that I didn't follow the same structure in every answer. Many people want to memorize a structure that they can apply to every question. The problem with that strategy is that your answer will sound contrived (fake). In this book, I tried to show you how to answer questions in a natural way. Don't start every question with the same phrase! For example, some people say, "In my view, my favourite trip was to France." The phrase "in my view" sounds very unnatural here because the question is not asking for your view!

The difference between beginner speakers and advanced speakers is that beginners cling to memorized words, phrases, and structures. If you want to have more variety in your speaking, you need to learn more words and phrases. I think a great way to do that is to watch my YouTube videos.



Sometimes people fail the test multiple times. Just remember, every time you fail, you are learning more English! Knowing English will really help you in your real life here in Canada. I hope you pass the first time, but don't worry if you fail. If your score is very close to what you need, my advice would be to simply retake the test (if you can afford it).

If you need an 8 in all categories, and your score is something like 7-7-6-5, I think it would be better to forget about CELPIP for a few months. Focus on learning more English. Then, try again and see how you do.
